

## Potential Change for Route 311 Riders

Metro Transit has been collaborating with Snoqualmie Valley residents, elected officials and community organizations over the past few months to design a public transportation system that meets the Valley's unique needs. We want to enhance mobility for Snoqualmie Valley residents in a way that is more cost-effective than fixed-route bus service alone.

This spring, Metro will recommend changes to Route 311 that would begin in September 2013. These changes are part of a larger revision of several Snoqualmie Valley bus routes and the starting of a new Intra-Valley Shuttle. Route 311 would be shortened to operate between Seattle and Woodinville and commute alternatives will be available between Woodinville and Duvall. Recommendations will be presented to King County Council in May for review and a decision.

### How would these changes affect you?

Riders who currently ride Route 311 between Woodinville and Duvall can continue using Metro Transit service to reach their destinations by using one of these alternative routes:

- Peak-period commuter Route 232 and all-day Route 224 will continue to connect Duvall and Redmond. Redmond Transit Center offers frequent, all-day service to downtown Seattle on Sound Transit Route 545.
- Route 931 will continue to operate between Avondale Road NE and Woodinville Park-and-Ride. The number of trips between Woodinville Park-and-Ride and downtown Seattle remains the same on Route 311.

In addition to fixed-route transit, Metro also helps people form vanpools, vanshares, and carpools. Today, more than 50 vanpools originate in the Snoqualmie Valley and travel to destinations throughout King County. Special incentives will be offered to encourage even more residents to try ridesharing, and especially to become vanpool or vanshare drivers. ### Other changes coming to Duvall

Metro is also proposing to revise Route 224 to operate between Duvall and Redmond with expanded service to Redmond Ridge. Service would increase to every 90 minutes between approximately 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. on weekdays. Alternative service will be provided between Duvall and Fall City on the new Snoqualmie Intra-Valley Shuttle with flexible routing in Duvall and North Bend.


The map on the back illustrates the proposed Route 311 changes and the new Intra-Valley Shuttle.

 ..... Deleted routing



-  Deleted routing


